

The Woodbury Holder keeps the Electric Pen in a vertical position, which is best adapted to produce good work. weight of the Electric Pen rests upon the point of the tube and the small leg which projects to the right of the holder. handle, which is held by the hand, corresponds exactly to that of an ordinary pen holder. It should be held firmly, but not so as to cramp the fingers or prevent freedom of motion.

Only a slight downward pressure is necessary. The jar resulting from the rapid motion of the Pen is not felt by the hand. The holder is much liked, especially by those who are not expert with the Electric Pen, as it enables any one to write in their natural handwriting, without practice. The attachment can be applied to any Electric Pen.
